STUDENT ELECTION DO'S AND DON'TS

Do's

- 1. Make speeches in classrooms and at club meetings (check with instructors and club officers before you go).
- 2. Be creative! The more unusual the idea, the more likely people will remember.
- 3. Hand out flyers (mini flyers, 1/2 or 1/4 sheet size, are best); make sure to include your name and position.
- 4. Participate in debates and open mic sessions.
- 5. Say your name at the beginning and end of your speeches.
- 6. Get a catchy slogan and friends to help you out.
- 7. Do buttons, hats, and any other items you can think of; make sure to include your name and position.
- 8. Use contacts that are available to you. If you have a contact who is a printer, call them up and ask if they will do you a favor (Keep track of cost of printing for reporting to the Election Committee.

 Donated item and services also count toward you campaign spending limit and must be reported).

Don'ts

- Don't disregard the DASG Election Code, Student Election Posting Guidelines, or any other Governing Documents.
- 2. Don't write in chalk on the ground or walls.
- 3. Don't take down, cover up, or deface other candidates' posters or flyers.
- 4. Don't campaign within fifty (50) feet or clearly visible or audible within fifty (50) feet of an open polling site.
