
Subject: Placement into ESL Curriculum and Transfer Course Completion

This report provides information on first-time students who either placed into ESL curriculum or began their ESL sequence during fall 2014. This information includes the rates of transfer-level course completion, the rates of ESL placement for F1 visa holders, and the average amount of credits obtained by ESL students when compared to English students.

3-Year Transfer Course Completion Rates

- 68% (40) of students who placed one-level below transfer completed a transfer-level ESL or English course in 3 years.
- 71% (92) of students who placed two-levels below transfer completed a transfer-level course.
- 62% (63) of students who placed three-levels below transfer completed a transfer-level course.
- 50% (38) of students who placed four-levels below transfer completed a transfer-level course.
- 27% (12) of students who placed five-levels below transfer completed a transfer-level course.
- 5% (1) of students who placed six-levels below transfer completed a transfer-level course.



F1 Visa Holders and Placement into ESL

- 50% (227) of students who obtained an ESL placement were international students (F1 visa holder) while 50% (265) were not international students.
- International students were the majority of students who placed two-levels below transfer-level (66%; 81), three-levels below transfer-level (56%; 63), and one-level below transfer-level (52%; 30).
- Non-international students were the majority of students who placed six-levels below transfer-level (100%; 20), placed at transfer-level (ESL 5) (75%; 5), five-levels below transfer-level (73%; 49), and four-levels below transfer-level (60%; 58).


F1 Visa Holders and 3-Year Transfer-Level Course Completion

International students have higher transfer-course completion rates than non-international students in most ESL placement levels:

- **Transfer-Level**: Both international and non-international students achieved 100% transfer-level course completion in 3 years.
- 1 Level Below Transfer: International students had higher transfer-level course completion by 13 percentage points.
- **2 Levels Below Transfer:** International students had higher transfer-level course completion by 20 percentage points.
- **3 Levels Below Transfer:** International students had higher transfer-level course completion by 15 percentage points.
- **4 Levels Below Transfer:** International students had higher transfer-level course completion by 12 percentage points.
- **5 Levels Below Transfer:** International students had higher transfer-level course completion by 25 percentage points, which was the biggest gap between international and non-international students.
- **6 Levels Below Transfer:** No first-time international students were placed at this level during fall 2014.



ESL Success:

Similar success and non-success rates were achieved by international students and non-international students:


- ESL success rates were 83% (495) for international students and 82% (780) for non-international students.
- Non-success rates were 13% (75) for international students and 12% (116) for non-international students.
- Withdraw rates were 4% (23) for international students and 6% (59) for non-international students.



EWRT Success:

International students had a higher success rate than non-international students by 12 percentage points, lower non-success rate by 6 percentage points, and lower withdraw rates by 6 percentage points.

- EWRT success rates were 89% (407) for international students and 77% (3165) for non-international students.
- Non-success rates were 7% (31) for international students and 13% (532) for non-international students.
- Withdraw rates were 4% (17) for international students and 10% (405) for non-international students.



Success Rates by ESL Level

In this section, success rates in each ESL level were compared between international students and Non-international students. Success in an ESL level was achieved when a student obtained a passing grade in all required ESL courses (A, B, C, and P), Non-Success was achieved when a student obtained a non-passing grade in any of the required ESL courses, and Withdraw was achieved when a student obtained a W grade in any one of the required ESL courses. These rates are for all registered ESL students during fall 2014.

Transfer-Level Course Success Rates (ESL 5):

Success rates were higher for international students by 7 percentage points, non-success rates were lower by 5 percentage points, and withdraw rates were lower by 2 percentage points when compared with non-international students.

One-Level Below Transfer-Level Course (ESL 272 and ESL 273):

Success rates were higher for non-international students by 7 percentage points, non-success rates were lower by 18 percentage points, and withdraw rates were higher by 11 percentage points when compared with international students.

Two-Levels Below Transfer-Level Course (ESL 262, ESL 263, and ESL 261):

Success rates were higher for international students by 12 percentage points, non-success rates were lower by 5 percentage points, and withdraw rates were lower by 7 percentage points when compared with non-international students.

Three-Levels Below Transfer-Level Course (ESL 252, ESL 253, and ESL 251):

Success rates were higher for international students by 17 percentage points, non-success rates were lower by 16 percentage points, and withdraw rates were lower by 1 percentage point when compared with non-international students.

Success rates were higher for non-international students by 2 percentage points, non-success rates were lower by 1 percentage point, and withdraw rates were lower by 1 percentage point when compared with international students.

Credits Attempted and Credits Passed

In this section, students' ESL and EWRT levels were based on first-time students' registration in the ESL or EWRT sequence and not based on placement test scores.

Average by Student:

• Transfer-level:

EWRT 1A students passed an average of 26.2 credits by the time they complete a transferlevel course while ESL 5 students passed an average of 24.3 credits.

• One-level Below transfer:

ESL students passed 22.1 credits more on average than EWRT students by the time they complete a transfer-level course.


• Two-levels Below transfer:

ESL students passed 29.3 credits more on average than EWRT students by the time they complete a transfer-level course.

• Three or more levels Below transfer:


On average, ESL students who were registered three-levels below transfer passed 101.9 credits by the time they complete a transfer-level course, four-levels below transfer passed 113.4 credits, five-levels below passed 120.1 credits, and six-levels below transfer passed 142.3 credits by the time they complete a transfer-level course.

Average by Term:


- **Transfer-Level:** Only 2 first-time students registered in transfer-level ESL during fall 2014. This cohort is too small to compare with 509 students who registered in the transfer-level EWRT course.
- **One-Level Below Transfer:** Only 7 first-time students registered in transfer-level ESL during fall 2014. This cohort is too small to compare with 835 students who registered in EWRT 211.
- **Two-Levels Below Transfer:** On average, ESL students attempted 2.2 more units and passed 3.6 more units per term than EWRT students. The most average units attempted in one term by ESL students was 16.6 during winter 2016, compared with an average of 12.7 units attempted by EWRT students.







• Three or More Levels Below Transfer:

- o 16.1 units were the most attempted average units by ESL students (n=132) who started three-levels below transfer during fall 2015 and spring 2016.
- o 15.2 units were the most attempted average units by ESL students (n=44) who started four-levels below transfer during spring 2015.
- 15.1 units were the most attempted average units by ESL students (n=44) who started five-levels below transfer during winter 2017.
- 12.1 units were the most attempted average units by ESL students (n=15) who started six-levels below transfer during winter 2015.









Terms until Transfer-Level Course Completion

In this section, students' ESL and EWRT levels were based on first-time students' registration in the ESL or EWRT sequence and not based on placement test scores.

• Transfer-level:

100% of transfer-level ESL and 84% EWRT students complete a transfer-level course between one and two terms.

• One-level below transfer:

52% of EWRT students who began their sequence one-level below transfer complete a transfer-level course during the first 4 terms of attendance, while 70% of ESL students at this level complete a transfer-level course between 3 and 6 terms.

• Two-levels below transfer:

51% of EWRT students who began their sequence two-levels below transfer have not yet completed a transfer-level course, while 55% of ESL students at this level complete a transfer course between 3 and 6 terms.

• Three-levels below transfer:

30% of ESL students who began their sequence at this level completed a transfer-level course between 6 and 7 terms, while 26% have not yet completed a transfer-level course.

• Four-levels below transfer:


23% of ESL students who began their sequence at this level completed a transfer-level course between 6 and 7 terms, while 39% have not yet completed a transfer-level course.


• Five-levels below transfer:

17% of ESL students who began their sequence at this level completed a transfer-level course between 8 and 9 terms, while 70% have not yet completed a transfer-level course.

• Six-levels below transfer:

18% of ESL students who began their sequence at this level completed a transfer-level course between 11 and 13 terms, while 83% have not yet completed a transfer-level course.
