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Subject: ESL Throughput Rates

Per request of the ESL department, below are the throughput rates of students starting in ESL courses. Throughput is defined as a student cohort that starts in a particular ESL level and successful (C or better) complete transfer level ESL5 or EWRT1A course in 6 terms. Summer terms are included in the preceding fall term for completions. The first course of enrollment in ESL is considered the starting level and the first transfer level course completed is the finishing level. Students do not need to be continuously enrolled but would need to complete the transfer level course by spring 2019 to be counted. **The report is divided into two sections**: Throughput rates for first-time ESL students and throughput rates for first-time degree/transfer seeking ESL students.

- Students who started in ESL234 in fall 2016 (26 students) had a throughput rate of 22% (8 student) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in ESL244 in fall 2016 (33 students) had a throughput rate of 43% (16 student) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in any ESL250 level course in fall 2016 (69 students) had a throughput rate of 34% (25 student) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in any ESL260 level course in fall 2016 (50 students) had a throughput rate of 37% (17 student) by spring 2019.

- Students who started in ESL200 in fall 2016 (6 students) had a throughput rate of 17% (1 student) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in ESL234 in fall 2016 (26 students) had a throughput rate of 14% (5 students) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in ESL244 in fall 2016 (33 students) had a throughput rate of 33% (12 students) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in any ESL250 level course in fall 2016 (69 students) had a throughput rate of 56% (41 students) by spring 2019.
- Students who started in any ESL260 level course in fall 2016 (50 students) had a throughput rate of 62% (33 student) by spring 2019.

As a comparison to ESL, the above throughput rates for first-time students starting in EWRT, READ or LART courses in fall 2016.

- The average overall throughput rate for students starting in the 200 level, **or two levels** below transfer level was 28%.
- The average overall throughput rate for students starting in the 211 level, or **one level below** transfer level was 49%.
- The average overall throughput rate for students starting directly in transfer level EWRT1A was 88%.
