Subject: EWRT Course Enrollment Based on AB 705 English Recommendations

Students who took an English or Reading assessment test between March 1, 2018 and September 26, 2018 were tracked to enrollment in a EWRT or READ course in summer 2017 or fall 2017. This analysis attempts to determine how many students would be placed into EWRT1A with or without concurrent support in compliance with the CCCCO's guidance and AB 705.

It should be noted that the English department will only accept actual transcript data for students. Within this analysis, we have transcripts for 59% of students (2,212/3747) who took a placement test. The 41% without transcripts would need to take a placement test. After fall 2019, there will no longer be a placement test available so other means will be necessary to place these students.

• 46% of students who took the English test and 21% of students who took the Reading test enrolled in a course in summer or fall 2017. However, the rate of students who enroll in courses may increase if placed directly into transfer-level EWRT.

- The majority (47%) of students who took the English test placed into transfer-level English followed by one-level below (41%).
- The majority of students who took the Reading test placed into one-level below for Reading (47%) followed by transfer-level English (39%).

- The largest group of students who would be placed into EWRT1A with no support with equal to or greater than a 2.6 GPA are students who placed into EWRT1A via the test (63% EWRT and 51% READ).
- The largest group of students who would place into EWRT1A with support recommended would be those students who tested into EWRT211 and/or READ211, 50% and 55% respectively.

- o In this group would be 40% of students who had placed into EWRT1A via the English test and 31% of students via the Reading test. Ultimately placing lower with their transcripts than with the test.
- The majority of students who would place into EWRT1A with support strongly recommended would be students who placed into EWRT200 via the English test and READ211 via the Reading test, 61% and 59% respectively.
 - o Again, a group of students would be placed lower via their transcripts than with the test, 26% placed directly into EWRT1A via the English test and 20% vi the Reading test.
- For students who do not have transcripts on file in CalPass Plus the majority placed directly into EWRT1A, 45% and 39%.

- Of students who took a placement test AND enrolled in the summer or fall terms, the majority placed into EWRT1A in all groups, with the exception of the <1.9 group.
 - o Overall, 610 students would place directly into EWRT1A without support, plus the 323 students who do not have transcript data available, plus students who passed EWRT211 in the spring or summer prior to the fall term. (See break outs below)

Course sequencing = students enrolled in prior course in spring/summer who enrolled in target course in fall.

Table 5 displays some, but not all of the possible ways students can enroll in EWRT1A. Overall, an estimated 1,134 students would be eligible for EWRT1A without support in fall 2018, based on fall 2018 estimates. Fall 2017 ran 51 sections of EWRT1A with 1,492 enrollments.

Table 6 shows that 621 students may be eligible for EWRT1A with support recommended in fall 2018. In fall 2017, there were 40 sections of EWRT211 with 1,027 enrollments.

Table 7 shows that 210 students may be eligible for EWRT1A with support strongly recommended in fall 2018. In fall 2017, there were 11 sections of EWRT200 with 260 enrollments.
