This is an introductory course instructed through CANVAS exploring the basic elements and principles of observational drawing, employing traditional and experimental media.

Student Learning Outcome Statements (SLO)

- The student will demonstrate freehand drawing skills using a variety of traditional drawing media such as charcoal, graphite, and ink.
- The student will create representational, objective drawings using references such as drawing from observation (still-life) and photographs.
- The student will demonstrate the ability to create drawing compositions based on linear perspective, the basic elements and principles of design.

Course Objectives:

- A. Demonstrate the use of freehand drawing skills using a variety of techniques.
- B. Demonstrate the use of basic elements and principles of composition.
- C. Apply drawing skills in the interpretation of subject matter using various media.
- D. Demonstrate ability to draw from an objective point of view as well as from the imagination.
- E. Demonstrate an understanding of the creative process.
- F. Compare and contrast works of art representing a diversity of art traditions and cultures.

Method:

The process of drawing develops a heightened awareness of the visual world, an awareness that is both subjective (knowing how you feel about things) and objective (understanding how things actually operate). Art is a way of realizing one's own individuality. The making of art, the making of the self, and the development of one's own personal style are part of the same exciting process. At first, we will work with direct experiences in rendering the objects and environment, while gradually exploring avenues in more imaginative ways (memories, dreams, life experiences, etc.).

Drop Policy:

You may be dropped from the class if you have 2 weeks consecutively of lack of communication or submittal of assignments.

Grading:

- 45% In class work and daily end of the class critique, (45 POINTS)
- 45% One subjective drawing project done as homework every three weeks with a typed paper. If you do not present your work but attend the critique, 5 point deduction. If you fail to attend the critique, deduct 10 points. (Non-typed paper receives a 3 point deduction.) (45 POINTS). Late submission of the project and the typed paper, deduct 5 points plus one, for every extra day.
- 10% Discussion and participation (10 POINTS)
- Final Project: This drawing embodies the course objectives noted above and is a
 performance proficiency exam. This drawing is presented at the final critique. Missing the
 final exam is an automatic F for the class. Your final grade will depend on your grasp
 and implementation of the theories and ideas we discuss in the class.

Grading Scale:

A= 90 to 100%, B= 80 to 89%, C= 70 to 79%, D= 60 to 69%, F= Below 60%, and missing the final exam. Academic Integrity (https://wwwdeanza.edu/policies/academic_integrity.html) Cheating and plagiarism will be reported.

Critiques on Projects:

All of the completed subjective drawing projects are required to be submitted on the due date for critique. Active participation is mandatory and is part of your final grade. Each participant must use critical thinking, constructive comments, and ask questions regarding techniques, content, and visual presentation.

Art critiques are a dialogue that is shared with others and is important to the artist and art making process. The first critic requires two thoughtful and critical comments by you, on two other students' projects which will earn you 5 possible points as part of your project grade.

Project Papers need to be typed and submitted with the drawing project assignments.
